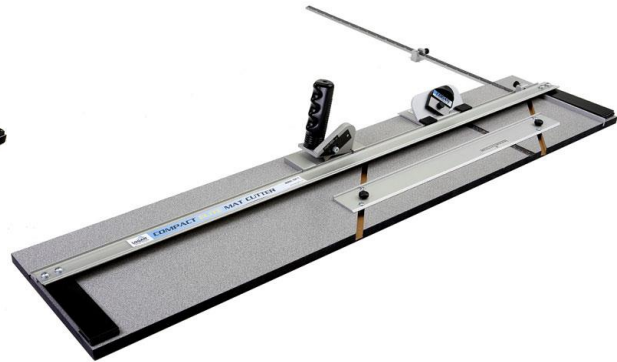


Comparison Guide; Logan 301-1 Compact Classic & Logan 350-1 Compact Elite



301-1 Model



350-1 Model

Logan are the leading manufacturers of mountcutters designed for Hobbyists & Artists, with these 2 models being the best sellers, but what are the differences?

Both models feature the baseboard with a fixed cutting rail, which allows for easy marking and precision of cutting. The parallel guide fence can be set to give border widths of 19mm to 114mm (3/4" to 4-1/2") and guarantees a straight cut, parallel to the edge of the board. The scale on the fence does away with the need for measuring out before the cut is made.

The key differences are how you cut the board to size before cutting the opening, and the production stops. With the 301-1 you need to measure and cut the board by hand with the craft knife, however with the 350-1 there is a squaring arm and cutter head that runs on the cutting rail making it easier to use. The Cutting rail is also fully hinged on the 350-1 allowing for slightly easier access with the board.
